CENTENARY COLLECTION

The Mentone Grammar Centenary in 2023 marked an exciting new era for our School – one defined by our contemporary, coeducational model. As such, we wanted our uniform to be reflective of this new age, focusing on changing student needs and community expectations.

WE ARE DELIGHTED TO LAUNCH THE MENTONE GRAMMAR 'CENTENARY COLLECTION'.

Following many months of design, review and community feedback, our award-winning Australian designer, Jonathan Ward, has worked with our suppliers Noone and OnTrack Sportswear to reimagine the academic and core PE uniform. The new Centenary Collection has the following key benefits:

- **GENDER-NEUTRAL:** students can select uniform items that best suit them regardless of gender. Different cuts and styles (e.g. tailored and relaxed) enable students to select items that best suit their own body type and personal preference.
- **ALL SEASON:** our new wardrobe approach includes a range of flexible, layering options so students can wear items all year if they wish, which also reduces the cost for families.
- **COMFORT:** we have improved the fabrics, fit and texture of items so they are more practical and comfortable to wear.

TRANSITION RULES

Ending December 2025

- The uniform transition period will run until the end of the 2025 academic year.
- All students (including all new commencing students in 2024) will be able to wear any combination of uniform items, 'existing' or 'new' during this transition period.
- Not all uniform items are 'new' – a small number of the 'old' academic and core PE items (e.g., the rugby top) will remain as part of the Centenary Collection for the time being.
- The 2024 uniform regulations outlined in this document will apply during this transition period.
- All students must be in the 'new' uniform from January 2026.

UNIFORM REGULATIONS APPEARANCE GUIDELINES

WHY UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE MATTER

At Mentone Grammar we are very proud of our students and the uniform they wear. We frequently have members of the public comment on how professional our students look, and local employers have reported that this is one of the factors they use when choosing their employees. But our uniform is much more than just about looking good.

Research shows that students who dress professionally actually do better at school and that dressing smartly gives people a broader perspective. School uniform also plays a key role in promoting pride, self-confidence, and a feeling of belonging within the School community, contributing to that sense of inclusion and positive wellbeing. A uniform can also eliminate distractions and allow students to focus on their studies, in particular removing the additional pressures of deciding what to wear and added stress of meeting the expectations of peers. Maintaining standards around appearance is not about squashing individuality, it is about creating boundaries as well as equity, safety and practicality for the School environment.

We ask all parents to help us maintain our standards for uniform and appearance, because when our students look smart, they learn smart!

HAIR, JEWELLERY AND MAKE-UP

- Hair is to be a consistent, natural colour, no shorter than a No.2 cut.
- No radical hair styles (such as undercuts, ridges, side shave designs and excessive mullets).
- Hair which is collar length or longer must be tied back, regardless of style.
- Hair ties to be natural colour. Navy or white ribbons, scrunchies or 'Alice Bands' can also be worn.
- Senior boys should be clean-shaven.
- No make-up or nail polish to be worn to school.
- Piercings – students may wear one small plain ear stud or sleeper per ear, through the earlobe. No other piercings are permitted at school.
- No additional jewellery is to be worn to school including rings (this excludes small religious symbols such as necklace crosses, which are permitted to be worn under garments).
- Students are permitted to wear a watch to school (smart watches are not permitted at school including excursions and Learning Journeys).

NOTE: If the above guidelines impact cultural or religious expression, students and/or parents should first speak with the relevant Head of Campus to discuss alternative options.

MARY JONES EARLY LEARNING CENTRE (ELC) GUIDELINES

TRAVEL TO AND FROM SCHOOL

Any crested item from the ELC uniform is suitable as the outer garment for travel to and from school for ELC students.

UNIFORM SPECIFICATIONS

The ELC uniform is very flexible and designed for play-based learning. Families can choose the items that work best for them (you do not need to purchase every item). All items can be worn at any time of year with either MG navy socks (or navy tights). All ELC students will require a Bucket Hat for outdoor play (compulsory).

SWIMMING

All students in the ELC will require the MG swim cap to participate in the School's swimming program (compulsory). ELC students can also choose to wear the MG swim wear, but this is not compulsory. Students can wear their own bathers/swim shorts.

NOTE: Bikinis or two-piece suits are NOT permitted.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

ELC students will also require the following items:

- Bags: MG backpack and MG Library bag
- Shoes: Sport runners (not sold at MG suppliers)

EBLANA UNIFORM

For students who continue their journey with Mentone Grammar into Foundation, a number of the ELC uniform items can continue to be worn in Foundation. See the table on page 17 for details.

FOUNDATION – YEAR 4

ACADEMIC UNIFORM GUIDELINES

TRAVEL TO AND FROM SCHOOL

Any crested item from the academic uniform is suitable as the outer garment for travel to and from school for students in Foundation – Year 4.

EXCEPTION: The core PE uniform can be worn to and from school on certain PE, Health, sport or House activity days as directed by the Eblana Campus (days will vary depending on the year level/class and timetable).

FORMAL OCCASIONS

Formal occasions include the following activities for Foundation – Year 4:

- Whole school assemblies, special events such as Founders' Day, or other occasions as determined by the Campus/School.
- Any outside excursions requiring school uniform to be worn (or as advised).

Formal occasions students in Foundation – Year 4 must choose one of the following options:

- Dress
- Tunic with long or short sleeve crested white shirt and a tie (top button closed).
- Pants/shorts with long or short sleeve crested white shirt and a tie (top button closed and shirt tucked in).
- All items can be worn with either MG navy socks or navy tights.
- Optional: an item of MG crested knitwear can also be worn.

UNIFORM SPECIFICATIONS

Students have the following options:

- **SHIRT:** Students can choose to wear a long or short sleeve crested white shirt any time of year, with any relevant lower garment (pants, shorts or tunic) – if no tie is present the shirt can be untucked and the top button only undone.

NOTE: Students wearing the 'old' long sleeve shirt (no crest) during the transition period must wear it tucked in as it is not designed to be untucked. Long sleeve skivvies/tops are not permitted under shirts.

- **TIE:** Students in Foundation – Year 4 can choose to wear a tie any time of year with a long or short sleeve crested white shirt. The top button must be closed and shirt tucked in when a tie is worn (see formal occasions above for special requirements).
- **PANTS/SHORTS:** These can be worn any time of year with a long or short sleeve crested white shirt and optional tie (as outlined above).
- **DRESS:** This can be worn any time of year with short MG navy socks or navy tights – the dress must sit on or below the knee (top button only undone).
- **TUNIC:** This can be worn any time of year with a long or short sleeve crested white shirt (tie required for formal occasions) – the tunic must sit on or below the knee.
- **KNITWEAR:** The optional crested vest, jumper and cardigan can be worn at any time of year as required (shirts should not be visible at the bottom of jumper/vest).
- **PUFFER VEST:** This optional item can be worn any time of year (excluding formal occasions).
- **RAINCOAT:** This optional crested jacket can be worn to and from school at any time of year.
- **BUCKET HAT:** This item is compulsory for Terms 1 & 4 (must be removed in class).
- **BEANIE:** This optional item can be worn outdoors as required in Terms 2 & 3 only.
- **SCARF:** This optional item can be worn as required in Terms 2 & 3 only.

ACADEMIC UNIFORM GUIDELINES (CONT.)

ADDITIONAL COMPULSORY REQUIREMENTS

- **SCHOOL SHOES:** (not sold at MG suppliers)
Must be black leather T-bar or lace-up school shoes (as per the examples provided below). Students are not permitted to wear runners, sneakers, or sport shoes of any kind with the academic uniform.
- **PE SHOES:** sport runners (not sold at MG suppliers)
- **MG BAGS:**
 - Backpack
 - Library bag
 - Swimming bag
 - Satchel

NOTE: The Mentone bags have not been redesigned as part of the uniform review so all existing bags can be used going forward.

PE/SPORTS WEAR

- See pages 12 – 14 for details of the core PE uniform requirements (including bathers) for students in Foundation – Year 4.

NOTE: The core PE uniform can be worn to and from school on certain PE, sport or House activity days as specified by the Eblana Campus. Days may differ depending on the year level/class and timetable.

YEARS 5–12

ACADEMIC UNIFORM GUIDELINES

BLAZER

The Blazer is a compulsory item for all students in Years 5 – 12.

- It is the primary outer garment to be worn to and from school and at all formal occasions (see below for details).
- In Year 11 students will be gifted a special VCE 'gold' pocket braid and 'gold' VCE tie for use in Years 11 & 12.

TRAVEL TO AND FROM SCHOOL

- **YEARS 5 – 12:** The primary outer garment is the Blazer.
- **TERMS 1 & 4:** Students should wear the Blazer to and from school, but if it is a warm day, students may wear the MG shirt/dress as the outermost garment.

NOTE: The MG scarf and beanie should not be worn in Terms 1 & 4.

- **TERMS 2 & 3:** Students should always wear their blazer to and from school. On particularly cold/wet days, students may choose to wear the MG raincoat (Years 5 & 6) or the outer quilted coat (Years 5 – 12) over, or instead of their Blazer, but removed in class (note these items can also be worn in Terms 1 & 4 on cold/wet days).
- **EXCLUDED ITEMS:** Students are not permitted to wear the MG knitted jumper/vest/cardigan, puffer vest, Year 12 hoodie or any other layering item as the outermost garment outside of school at any time.
EXCEPTION: Greenways fleece may be worn by Year 9 students only, to and from school in place of the Blazer.

NOTE: The Blazer may still be required at school e.g. for special activities or formal occasions, so should be carried to/from school.

CORE PE UNIFORM

On days where students have AGSV/APS sports training afternoons/days, they can travel to and from school in the core PE uniform AND attend any on-campus formal events (see pages 13 – 14 for Core PE uniform guidelines).

FORMAL OCCASIONS

Formal occasions include the following activities for Years 5 – 12:

- School assemblies and chapel services, or other occasions as determined by the Campus/School.
- Special events such as Academic Celebration Evening, Carols Service and Founders' Day.
- Any outside excursions requiring school uniform to be worn (or as advised).

Formal occasions students in Years 5 – 12 must choose one of the following options:

- Dress + Blazer.
- Pants/shorts/skirt with long or short sleeve crested white shirt (top button closed and shirt tucked in) and a tie + Blazer.

NOTE: The Year 9 Greenways Jacket can be worn instead of the Blazer for any on-campus formal events (unless otherwise instructed).

- All items can be worn with either MG navy socks or navy tights.
- Optional: for **on-campus** formal events an item of knitwear, can be worn under the Blazer (unless otherwise instructed). The puffer vest or Year 12 hoodie cannot be worn at formal events.

YEARS 5–12

ACADEMIC UNIFORM GUIDELINES (CONT.)

UNIFORM SPECIFICATIONS

Unless stated as compulsory, students can choose the range of uniform items that work best for them.

- **BLAZER:** Must be worn for formal occasions and is the primary garment for travel to and from school (see page 10 for details).
- **SHIRT:** Students can choose to wear a long or short sleeve crested white shirt any time of year, with the top button only undone.
- any relevant lower garment (pants, shorts or skirt) – if no tie is present the shirt can be untucked.
- **NOTE:** Students wearing the 'old' long sleeve shirt (no crest) during the transition period must wear it tucked in as it is not designed to be untucked. Long sleeve skivvies/tops are not permitted under shirts.
- **TIE:** It is optional for students in Years 5 – 12 to wear a tie any time of year with a long or short sleeve crested white shirt. The top button must be closed and shirt tucked in when a tie is worn (see formal occasions on page 10 for special requirements).
- **PANTS/SHORTS:** These can be worn any time of year with a long or short sleeve crested white shirt and optional tie (as outlined above).
- **DRESS:** This can be worn any time of year with short MG navy socks or navy tights – the dress must sit on or below the knee (top button only undone).
- **SKIRT:** This can be worn any time of year with a long or short sleeve crested white shirt (plus optional tie) and short MG navy socks or navy tights – the skirt must sit on or below the knee (shirt must be tucked in if worn with a tie).
- **KNITWEAR:** The optional crested vest, jumper and cardigan can be worn at any time of year as required (shirts should not be visible at the bottom of jumper/vest).
- **PUFFER VEST:** This optional item can be worn any time of year.

NOTE: For Years 5–12 it cannot be the outer garment worn as a travel item to and from school – see page 10 for details.

- **RAINCOAT (YEARS 5 & 6) OR OUTER QUILTED COAT (YEARS 5 – 12):** On wet/cold days, these optional crested coats can be worn as an alternative to the Blazer to and from school (the Blazer may still be required while at school so should be carried/worn under the coat).
- **CAP/BUCKET HAT:** Compulsory for Terms 1 & 4 for students in Years 5 – 8 (must be removed in class).
- **BELT:** This optional item can be worn with shorts or pants as required.
- **BEANIE:** This optional item can be worn outdoors as required in Terms 2 & 3 only.
- **SCARF:** This optional item can be worn as required in Terms 2 & 3 only.

ADDITIONAL COMPULSORY REQUIREMENTS

- **SCHOOL SHOES:** (not sold at MG suppliers)
Must be black leather T-bar or lace-up school shoes (as per the examples shown on page 8). Students are not permitted to wear runners, sneakers, or sport shoes of any kind with the academic uniform.
- **PE SHOES:** sport runners (not sold at MG suppliers)
- **MG BAGS:**
 - Backpack
 - Sports bag (Years 7 – 12 & Years 5 – 6 optional)

PE/SPORTS WEAR

- See pages 13 – 14 for details of the core PE uniform requirements (including bathers) for students in Years 5 – 12.

CORE PE UNIFORM GUIDELINES

REQUIREMENTS

Students require the following items to participate in PE/sport training. All other items are optional and can be purchased as required.

- At least one PE Polo Top (short or long sleeve)
- At least one pair of shorts, trackpants or leggings
- White sport socks (optional MG sport socks)
- Appropriate sport runners (not sold at MG suppliers)

Students will also require a compulsory House top which should be worn for any relevant House activities (or as advised).

CONDITIONS OF WEAR

Foundation – Year 6

The core PE uniform can be worn to and from school on any PE, Health, sport or House days, or as directed by Eblana (Foundation – Year 4) or Riviera (Years 5 & 6) campuses (days will vary depending on the year level/class and timetable).

Years 7 – 12

The core PE uniform can be worn to and from school when students have AGSV/APS sports training afternoons.

- Years 7 & 8 (Tuesday)
- Years 9 & 10 (Thursday)
- Years 11 & 12 (Wednesday)

Years 7 & 8: the PE uniform can also be worn to and from school on days when students have PE/Health.

Years 9 – 12: the PE uniform CANNOT be worn to and from school for a single PE/Health lesson, or after morning sports training. Students must bring their PE kit to change into before and after the lesson.

SWIM PROGRAM

Students in Foundation – Year 6 will require a Mentone Grammar Swim Cap, to participate in the compulsory PE Swim Program. Students can choose to wear the MG swim wear, but this is not compulsory. Students can wear their own bathers/swim shorts.

NOTE: Bikinis or other two-piece suits are NOT permitted. For AGSV/APS interschool competitions, students must wear MG swim wear OR any brand of racing swimsuit if the competition permits it. Students will also require the MG Swim Cap for competitions.

COMPULSORY SPORT – AGSV/APS COMPETITIONS (YEARS 7–12)

Compulsory AGSV/APS sport teams will have more specific uniform requirements:

- See AGSV/APS Sports Uniform Guide for details.

Students are expected to be in the correct sports attire (including specialist socks, footwear and safety equipment e.g., mouth guards/shin guards) for each sport in which they participate.
