Overview

Mentone Grammar is a K-12 co-educational School. The School is an open-entry school, drawing student from local Bayside and surrounding suburbs. The School became co-educational in 2006 and adopted a unique Together-Apart-Together model of education, which has resulted in continual growth. The School has a strong philosophy of ensuring that students are happy, healthy, and high achieving.

Values

Respect – We value other people and their thoughts and feelings. We listen to them, are truthful towards them and accept them as individuals.

Greenways Café Program

The Greenways Campus is Mentone Grammar's Year 9 campus and includes the Greenways Café. The Greenways Café Program is a compulsory part of the Year 9 curriculum where students learn how to work in all sections of a Café under supervision. The students participate from 8am-3.30pm and are responsible for the day-to-day operation of the Café, including food preparation and handling, assisting with ordering and receiving consumables, marketing, sales, cash handling and customer service. Groups of 10-12 students spend 7.5 days in the program which Includes six days in the Cafe, one day excursion learning "Prepare and Serve Espresso" and a half day incursion learning "Basic Food Handling". As part of our evolving program there will be a new coffee truck joining the Cafe program. Staff and students will operate this at different locations in the school.

Main Responsibilities

The following responsibilities are not exhaustive, nor necessarily in order of priority, but are indicative of the range and nature of the role.

Reporting to the GC Program Manager, the Greenways Café Teacher will assist with delivering the program and provide support to Year 9 students, to enable them to work in all the café areas successfully. In addition they will assist the GC Program Manager with Café procedures, menus and delivering recipe instructions to students.





Key responsibilities include:

- Assisting the GC Program Manager with the day-to-day teaching of students in café skills and working closely as part of a small team
- Providing differentiation in the kitchen classroom for students that require modification in some way.
- Observe and record correct student practices linked to the Prepare and Serve Espresso & Basic Food Handling course
- Providing demonstrations and delivering theory to ready students for Assessment
- Working with small groups in the new Coffee Truck away from the Cafe.
- Supporting students' learning, development and performance with coffee skills, food preparation and customer service
- Assisting with the set-up and pack-up of the Café and/or coffee truck according to procedures
- Explicitly training Year 9 students with all food preparation and food handling activities, ensuring a clean, tidy and safe environment is maintained.
- Supporting students with ordering, receiving and storing consumables in accordance with food and safety guidelines
- Ensuring the Café is always compliant with all Health and Safety and Food Hygiene regulations
- Operating the Espresso machine and coffee grinder.
- Assisting with the documentation of work instructions and procedures, such as Café procedures and recipes
- Assisting Year 9 students with additional functions out of school hours
- Encouraging and contributing to Mentone Grammar being a healthy, safe place of work.
